What's Happening?

Now that we're at mid-year it's time to bring you up to date on what our East Jersey Chapter has been doing and what it's working on for the future.

The Chapter has a higher State-wide profile since one of our members, Kelly Buchta, now represents the northern part of NJ as a vice-president of TU's State Council. She also handles National TU's Women's Initiative so, if you would like to get a female friend or relative involved in fly-fishing, conservation or any other aspect of Trout Unlimited's activities, talk to Kelly at one of our meetings.

We have been talking about helping in the removal of a dam on the Cresskill Brook for more than a year but by the time you read this most of the structural work should be complete. During the last week in May New Jersey's Sanzari Construction company is scheduled to lower the water level behind the dam and then broach it. After this, Joseph Urbani's group from Boseman, Montana will rebuild the section of the brook where the dam had been. We in EJTU and Brian Cowden, National TU's only employee in NJ, will have helped relocate fish from the pool behind the dam and, after the area settles down, EJTU will be responsible for planting along the new stream banks. When all work is done the native brookies in the

Weather was on the cool side with occasional light rain and even a little wet snow but, other than wind messing up some of Tom's casts, it did not impact the fishing. Water level was moderately high and dropping after the prior week's heavy showers. There was scant insect activity on the surface, so we mostly fished steelhead style streamers and had some good catches.



I am not embarrassed to say I was out-fished by Mark who had two nice browns, a nice rainbow and a few smallmouth bass. (See attached photo of Mark with the rainbow) It was a great day and a good learning experience for me as I had never fished from a drift boat, nor at all in the upper Delaware River.

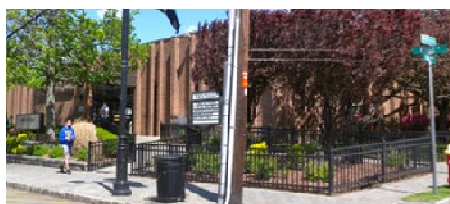


For those of you nearer to Montclair than to Paramus look for an announcement of specific dates after the summer.

stream will have a greater range in which to live.
