Bear Swamp Road

If you are one of the anglers who like to fish for the small native Brook Trout that are found in Bear Swamp Brook you will have to learn to share Bear Swamp Road with vehicles from the Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company (TGP). The company is constructing a gas pipeline that will bring natural gas from fracking fields in Pennsylvania to Bergen County through an expanded pipeline that will parallel the existing smaller one and has an easement to use the road for its vehicles.

TGP had agreed to limit its use of the road to pickup trucks and vans that would be used to ferry personnel to work sites. However, local residents feared that TGP would also drive tankers, trucks carrying explosives and acetylene, and other heavy equipment on the road. In a February 6, 2013 article in the VILLADOM TIMES a local resident claimed to have been given Bergen County documents indicating that weight limits on the road's bridges would be increased from 6,000 pounds to 20,000 pounds.

In the article cited above, the same local resident also claimed that cranes are already being brought up Bear Swamp Road.

Following a court hearing on TGP's use of the road and on condemnations and easements

EJTU Fly Fishing School



If you know of anyone who would like to attend a comprehensive, cheap course on how to fish with a fly rod tell them about the EJTU course at Paramus's Westbrook Middle School that begins on March 26.

on local property, District Court Judge William K. Martini granted the easements as well as a temporary access road easement so TGP may travel on Bear Swamp Road over portions of several local private properties. This was on condition that TGP use the road only for transporting workers

to a metering station in Mahwah. TGP is now in court asking for a permanent easement so personnel can use the road for future maintenance.

It will now be interesting to see whether fishermen, hikers and others who are accustomed to using Bear Swamp Road can

easily coexist with the vehicles that TGP uses on the road.

TU members who visit the area should also try to check the quality of Bear Swamp Brook as TGP increases its use of a road that parallels a delicate stream that contains our rare native trout.
