The recipe for the pattern can be found in many fly tying books. However, to even out the field we have selected the pattern as found in "Essential Trout Flies" by Dave Hughes and require that it be tied on a size 10 hook. The pattern for the Royal Wulff as given in Dave Hughes book is:

Hook	Standard dry fly
Thread	Black 6/0 or 8/0
Wings	White calf tail upright
o .	and divided
Tail	Moose body hair
Body	Peacock herl, red floss,
J	peacock herl
Hackle	*

Enter as many flies as you like. Flies will be judged by a panel of five with entries coded to conceal the name of the tier. The winner will be announced and presented his/her plaque at the annual dinner on March 19, 2004. The closing date for entries has been changed to March 1, 2004. Flies may be mailed to our post office box or turned in to any director. They may also be left at the fly-fishing counter of the Ramsey Outdoor store in Paramus.

New Year! New License!

It's that time again for those of us who fish in New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Time to get a new fishing license, that is. Why not New York? Because if you've been fishing there you should already have gotten your new license a few months ago.

New Jersey and Pennsylvania are again selling their licenses over the Internet but New York requires you to go to a dealer, mail an application, or call 1-866-933-2257.

Don't forget that you may be eligible for special consideration when applying for a license. As Don Sirota pointed out in November's Riffles, NJ's Disabled Veterans are entitled to free fishing licenses. New York's active duty servicemen and women are eligible for free resident licenses. Any active duty serviceman/woman is entitled to a resident New Jersey license. The Pennsylvania Commission has contradictory statements on its web page, so you had better contact them to get details of any military service benefits that are offered. Here's a list of the license fees at each state (no increases that I can see so don't let any politicians know) along with their web addresses.

Ramapo Ramblin'

Happy New Year! Looks like I should rename my column Ramapo Roarin' with the river over the banks at this writing! The beginning of the year is always a good time to review the past year and look forward to the new.

Last year was an active year with about fifty EJTU volunteers participating in various conservation projects. We helped the NJ Fish and Wildlife float and bucket stock about four thousand trout at Halifax Road, Glen Gray Road and at Britt's Tackle Shop. We also stocked three hundred rainbows in the Glen Grav area this fall. We delivered one hundred brochures to homeowners along the Ramapo advising them of the importance of helping keep the river pristine. An electro-shocking was done in August at Glen Gray Road and fourteen browns and one rainbow were found, proving that they do survive the summer. Further testing will be done in the coming year. PSA and oxygen levels were found to be excellent.

Wildlife Management Area 3 (WMA3) plans on performing weekly water tests and analysis of the Ramapo, Pequannock, Wanaque, and Pompton Rivers. The testing will be done at state certified labs. They are also looking into having volunteers certified to collect samples and deliver them to the labs. At this point it is in the talking stage. Rich Malizia informs us that he and Dr. Cristini of Ramapo College are once again planning to invite 120 middle school kids to the annual Ramapo Day festival. The event will be held on Saturday, June 14 at Halifax Road in Mahwah. We need at least 25 volunteers to assist, so why not put it on your calendar to attend? I assure you that it will be a day you will enjoy. Last year we had a giant snapping turtle show up uninvited

and the year before a five-foot black snake crossed the path of the kids on their nature walk!

The EJTU dinner will be held at the Rustic Lodge in Elmwood Park on Friday March 19. You can help support the chapter and have a great night out so bring your spouse and friends.
